



BAHRAIN ELECTIONS 2022

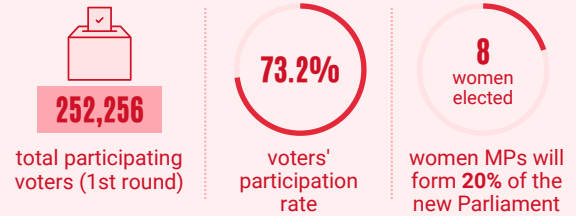
20 years since the country's first parliamentary elections, Bahraini citizens headed to polls to elect 40 members of the Council of Representatives (Majlis Al-Nuwab), the Lower House of the National Assembly, for the sixth legislative term. The 2022 elections saw a record number of candidates, including 74 women, vying for seats, which resulted in the highest voters' participation and most elected women MPs since 2002.

2022 ELECTIONS TO THE COUNCIL OF REPRESENTATIVES

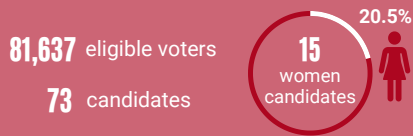
4 ELECTORAL DISTRICTS, 40 CONSTITUENCIES + 37 VOTING CENTRES ABROAD

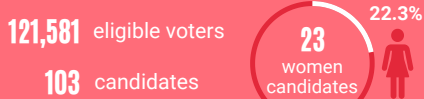
MUHARRAQ GOVERNORATE: 8 SEATS



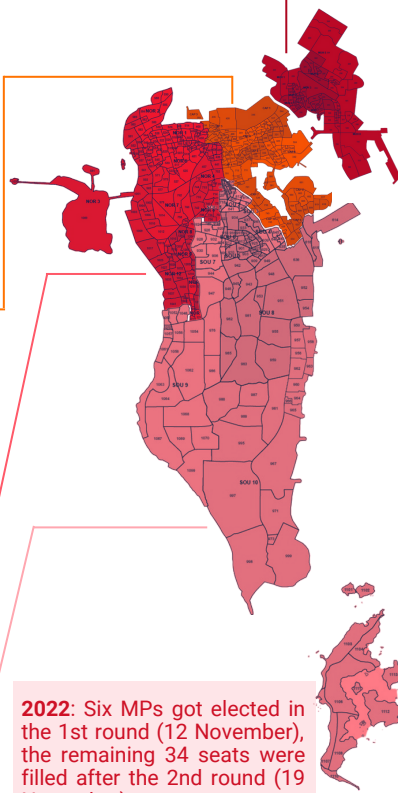
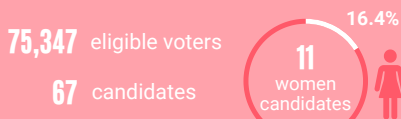
CAPITAL GOVERNORATE: 10 SEATS

2022: Six MPs got elected in the 1st round (12 November), the remaining 34 seats were filled after the 2nd round (19 November).

Two-round voting system: the top two candidates go to the second round if no one got more than 50% in the first round.

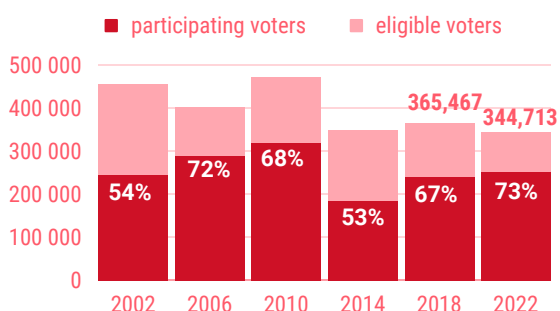

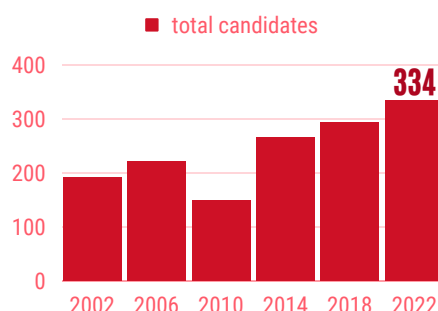
